Gardens are still GO!

Despite misleading rumours about just what is happening to the former International Garden Festival Site that have been circulating lately, probably connected to the Euro Elections held recently, the plans for the site are proceeding.

The Chairwoman and Hon Sec have been keeping in touch with Langtree, the developers of the Garden Festival Site, since the Secretary of State gave the go ahead for the scheme.

Sadly the whole thing has been affected by the International Recession. MacLeans the builders have gone into liquidation, and Langtree's have been looking for other ways to proceed with the creation, or restoration of the park.

Delicate negotiations are under way and it is hoped that an announcement that progress will be made by Langtree shortly.

In the meantime Langtree have issued the following statement:

"The International Garden Festival site is a key part of our development portfolio and we remain committed to realising a development that will breathe new life into the site. Our aim of returning a significant proportion of the site to its former splendour as a new green public open space for the city is moving forward.

It is a condition of our planning consent that the public space is delivered prior to any other element of the scheme. We are working hard behind the scenes on this and will let people know as soon as we reach any key milestones."

Police and Security Matters

Merseyside Police have been conducting a campaign against "Anti Social Behaviour", with some effect. There has been a big down turn in the number of arrests and reported incidents over the last year.

One thing that is in CAP is a link to "Immobilise Property Crime" a UK national property register, which looks useful. There are many other useful tips in CAP.

You can click on the live systems and then select a Homewatch covering your area (only 5 at present) and enter the system - you can send feedback via the reporting button, on each page " submit a report" on what you think.

Phone scam.

If you receive a phone call on your mobile from any person, saying that he or she is a company engineer, or telling you that they're checking your mobile line, and you have to press #90 or #09 or any other number, end this call immediately without pressing any numbers.

There is a fraud company using a device that once you press #90 or #09 they can access your 'SIM' card and make calls at your expense.

Forward this message to as many colleagues, relatives and friends as you can, to stop it.

Crime Fighters

Hon Sec Reg Cox and his wife Ina attended a conference on Crime Fighting and received briefings on various methods of defending yourselves and your property against crime and criminals. Basically, it is common sense and awareness that are the main defence. Don't leave windows open, when you go out, your insurance may be invalidated if you make it easy for a burglar. Don't leave house or car keys on the "hall table". or anywhere that they may be stolen. Be aware of "Hook and Cane" robberies, this is where a cane with a hook on the end is inserted through your

letter plate and your keys hooked and removed. If you are going away on holiday, let your trusted neighbours know, and leave them your house keys, or the phone number of a friend or relative who has your keys.

United Utilities in Priory Wood

Collapsed sewer repairs to be completed

A collapsed sewer on Riverside Drive, Liverpool will soon be fully repaired by United Utilities.

Following the collapse in November last year a temporary repair has been in place, but now the water company is pleased to be in the position to make a full repair. Engineers will begin work on Monday, June 8 and the repairs are expected to take up to three months to complete. United Utilities' Project Co-ordinator Ken Gee said: "We will start by using the existing site to set up a works compound along with a temporary road surface to allow us access to Priory Wood from Riverside Drive.

"As this is a conservation area we have worked with local council's Tree Officer and Greenspace Manager to prepare the site for our main construction work.

"We will also be carrying out a replanting scheme in the area once the work is completed."

The collapsed sewer has caused localised disruption and temporary repairs were made to minimise impact to residents.

When company experts investigated the whole length of the remaining sewer they found that a large section was in need of repair.

The main construction work will see engineers installing a new 60m section of replacement sewer using traditional trenching techniques as well as lining 350m of the existing brick sewer in order to preserve and maintain its usage. Several new manholes will also be constructed from Riverside Drive into Southwood Road.

Ken said: "The need to construct new manholes is essential as following the sewer's subsequent collapse in January this year, St Michael's railway station has been flooded."

This project has been particularly difficult and challenging to engineer, as the sewer is a staggering nine metres below ground.

The route of the work will go past the local cricket ground, past the railway station and out onto Southwood Road.

Local residents may experience some short-term disturbance due to construction-related traffic.

It is also expected that there will be some traffic diversions around the railway station.

On-road parking on Southwood Road will be temporarily removed and a minor road closure will be put in place.

Ken added: "We will do everything possible to keep disruption to a minimum.

"We will be working on-site Mondays to Fridays from 8am-6pm in order to minimise any noise disturbance as much as possible.

"I would however like to apologise in advance for any inconvenience this work may cause and I thank local residents for their patience.

"This is an essential piece of work to repair an old sewer in need of repair.

"We are committed to delivering these improvements as quickly and efficiently as we can."

Local residents have had letters sent informing them of the scheme.

As stated in the letter, to explain the project in more detail we will have representatives on board our Mobile Visitors Centre which will be located at Aigburth Cricket Club, Southwood Road on Wednesday 15 July 8am – 8pm. They will be able to show visitors plans of the work and answer any question they may have.
